

Application period open. 16th edition (2017-2018) Master's degree on Public Policies and Programmes Evaluation

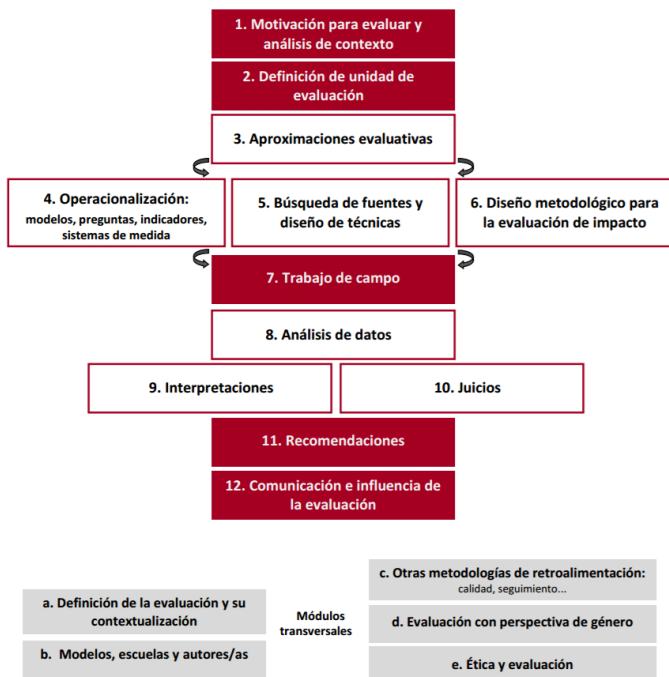
The aim of the Master's degree is for students to acquire essential abilities in designing, managing, conducting and critically analyzing evaluations. The course provides students with the necessary tools to implement an evaluation in a variety of contexts, allowing the student to adapt the assessment process of various actors and purposes.

The Master's degree is a recognized, consolidated postgraduate programme in Europe. We are members of and collaborate with the principal professional international evaluation networks and we promote and participate with various working groups and researchers in evaluation. We follow and support the careers of our postgraduate students, totalling more than 300 graduates over 15 years of programme experience. The relevance and importance of our postgraduates and their academic recognition are due to the high level of our instructors, to their pedagogic, theoretical-practical approach and to the constant updating of the programme.

In classroom learning of the Master's degree will take place from October 2017 to June 2018 with bi-weekly classes on Friday (morning and afternoon) and Saturday (morning only). In addition, course work is provided related to meetings and tutored by experts in the field.

Language: Classes are taught mostly in Spanish. You need to have a passive knowledge (understanding) thereof.
