

Robert Picciotto resides in New Zealand and acts as Senior Independent Evaluation Adviser to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade. He has specialised in international development evaluation. He taught evaluation at King's College (London) from 2012 to 2015. He is a graduate of the Ecole Nationale Supérieure de l'Aéronautique (France) and of the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs (Princeton University).

Robert ('Bob') is a member of the Academy of Social Sciences and a board member of the European Evaluation Society and the UK Evaluation Society. At the World Bank, which he joined in 1962, Bob held several operational and corporate management positions including Director of Projects Departments in three Regions, Vice-President, Corporate Planning and Budgeting and Director-General of the Independent Evaluation Group (1992-2002).

Since his retirement from the World Bank, he has provided independent evaluation advice to the UK Department for International Development, the Asian Development Bank, the African Development Bank, the Council of Europe Development Bank, the International Fund for Agriculture Development, the United Nations Development Program, the Global Environment Facility, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, Sweden's Ministry for Foreign Affairs, the Swedish Agency for Development Evaluation, and the Rockefeller Foundation.
